## Important Items to Recycle



**Did you know...** that every year Americans throw away enough paper to make a 12-foot wall from New York to California? See the following for some of the most important items to recycle.

**Aluminum:** Turning recycled cans into new cans takes 95 percent less energy than making brand-new ones.

**PET Plastic Bottles:** Nearly 80 percent of those bottles will end up in a landfill. Making plastic out of recycled resources uses about two-thirds less energy than making new plastic. Plastic bottles are the most commonly used and are usually the easiest to recycle.

**Newspaper:** According to the [Environmental Protection Agency](http://www.epa.gov), paper makes up about one-third of the all the municipal waste stream in the U.S.

**Corrugated Cardboard:** Old corrugated cardboard (OCC) represents a significant percentage of the commercial solid waste stream. Next time UPS delivers a big box to your office or home, be sure to break it down and recycle it.

**Steel Cans:** Just like aluminum, steel products can be recycled over again without compromising the quality of the steel. Steel auto parts or appliances can be recycled also. You can learn more about steel recycling by visiting the [Steel Recycling Institute](http://www.steelrecycling.com) website.

**HDPE Plastic Bottles:** HDPE stands for high-density polyethylene which is used for detergent, bleach, shampoo and milk jugs. HDPE plastics are identified by the logo on the bottom of the container. Logo numbers 1 and 2 are recyclable in Concord Township. Rinse and clean all of your HDPE containers. Any dirt or food particles can contaminate the recycling process.

**Glass Containers:** Recycled glass saves 50 percent energy versus virgin glass and recycling just one glass container saves enough energy to light a 100-watt bulb for four hours. Recycled glass generates 20 percent less air pollution and 50 percent less water pollution. One ton of glass made from 50 percent recycled materials saves 250 pounds of mining waste.

**Magazines and Mixed Paper:** Recycled paper saves 60 percent of energy versus virgin paper and generates 95 percent less air pollution. Recycling one ton of paper saves 17 trees and 7,000 gallons of water.

**Computers:** Giving old, working computers to friends and family members or donating them to nonprofit organizations not only keeps the computer entirely out of the waste stream, but it presents computer access to someone who might not otherwise be able to afford it. Non-working computers can be sent to recycling centers where they are dismantled and valuable components are recovered.
