The Concord Township Board of Supervisors is proud to host its fall **Recycling Day**, providing township residents with an opportunity to responsibly recycle electronics (anything with a plug), shred documents, donate used clothing and other household items. Township igloos will be available for drop-off of paper, cardboard, glass, aluminum, plastics and inkjet cartridges.

Township residents will also have the chance to sign up for Leaf Pick-up Day which will take place on Wednesday, November 16, 2016.

This event is for Concord Township residents ONLY - PROOF OF RESIDENCY REQUIRED.

ONE - TV or CRT computer monitor accepted per Concord Township Household.

NOT ACCEPTED - smoke detectors, large appliances, projection TVs, wooden console TVs, hazardous waste/liquids, loose batteries or fluorescent bulbs.

TVs are NOT TO BE DROPPED OFF PRIOR TO THE EVENT.

The facility will be closely monitored for illegal dumping on the premises.

Board of Supervisors Public Meeting Highlights

Adopted

• The Post-Issuance Federal Tax Law Compliance Policy for the Obligations

This policy sets forth specific policies and procedures of the Township designed to monitor post-issuance compliance of Obligations issued by the Township with applicable provisions of the IRS Code of 1986, and describes various procedures designed to identify facts relevant to demonstrating compliance with the requirements that must be satisfied subsequent to the issuance of Obligations in order that the interest on such continue to be excludable for gross income for federal income tax purposes.

• Post-Issuance Compliance Policy for Obligations Subject to Rule 15c2-12 Under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934

This policy sets forth specific policies and procedures of the Township designed to monitor post-issuance compliance of Obligations issued by the Township with applicable provisions of Rule 15c2-12, promulgated under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (the "Rule"). This policy describes various procedures and systems designed to identify facts which may be relevant to demonstrating compliance with the requirements that must be satisfied subsequent to the issuance of Obligations in order that the Township complies with its continuing disclosure undertakings.

• Resolution No. 45-2016: PennDOT Liquid Fuels - Quaker Lane

PennDOT maintains an inventory of township streets for the purpose of computing the disbursement of certain liquid fuels funds to the Township. Upon review of PennDOT's information, Quaker Lane was not shown on its map. The purpose of this resolution is to add this dedicated township road to PennDOT's inventory for liquid fuels disbursements.





Trees

Trees are not only a beautiful addition to the landscape, but they also provide invaluable benefits. They reduce heat by cooling and shading homes and streets during the hot summer months. They naturally clean the air of pollutants and provide oxygen. Trees can provide some privacy, create a natural noise buffer and help reduce ultra-violet rays. Trees improve stormwater management, reducing the amount of polluted stormwater that normally would go directly into storm drains. Tree roots also allow rainwater to filter back into the soil, recharging the often thirsty water table.

A new Pennsylvania law that went into effect August 2016 requires a child under 2 years of age be securely fastened in a rear-facing child passenger restraint system, which is to be used until the child outgrows the maximum weight and limits designated by the manufacturer.

In addition, children ages 8 to 18 must be wearing a seat belt when riding anywhere in the vehicle. Also, drivers and front-seat passengers 18 years-old or older are required to buckle up. If motorists are stopped for a traffic violation and are not wearing their seat belt, they can receive a second ticket and second fine.
